Dear Parent/Guardian and Student:

Welcome back to another great school year at Cuero High School as we strive to create a learner-centered environment! I have very high expectations for my students, in their academic development, as well as in their behavior performance during <u>Spanish Class</u>. I believe strongly in building good communication between the teacher, the parents/guardians, and the student as a vital factor in the achievement of the child's academic success.

**USE OF THE TARGET LANGUAGE IN THE CLASSROOM:** Research indicates that effective language instruction must provide significant levels of meaningful communication<sup>\*</sup> and interactive feedback in the target language in order for students to develop language and cultural proficiency. The pivotal role of target-language interaction in language learning is emphasized in the *K-16 Standards for Foreign Language Learning in the 21st Century*. ACTFL (American Council on the Teaching of Foreign Languages) therefore recommends that language educators and their students <u>use the target language as exclusively as possible (90% plus) at all levels of instruction</u> during instructional time and, when feasible, beyond the classroom. In classrooms that feature maximum target-language use, instructors use a variety of strategies to facilitate comprehension and support meaning-making. For example, they:

- 1. provide comprehensible input that is directed toward communicative goals;
- 2. make meaning clear through body language, gestures, and visual support;
- 3. conduct comprehension checks to ensure understanding;
- 4. negotiate meaning with students and encourage negotiation among students;
- 5. elicit talk that increases in fluency, accuracy, and complexity over time;
- 6. encourage self-expression and spontaneous use of language;
- 7. teach students strategies for requesting clarification and assistance when faced with comprehension difficulties;
- 8. offer feedback to assist and improve students' ability to interact orally in the target language.
